City of Gardiner Downtown Stormwater Management Study

Sturgeon, anyone?

The golden sturgeon gracing the weathervane atop the building at Church and Mechanic Streets has served as the official symbol of Gardiner since our recent bicentennial celebration in 2003. The sturgeon is a potent reminder of the fishing heritage of the city, as these huge, powerful fish – one of the oldest species of bony fish in existence – can still be caught in the local waters. In fact, the Cobbooseconte's name is derived from the native Abanaki name "Cabbassaguntiag," which means "the place where sturgeon abound."

PROJECT DESCRIPTION (completed February 2018)

The City of Gardiner conducted a study to assess portions of its downtown storm drainage system, evaluate alternatives for improvements to mitigate the impacts of periodic flooding, make priority recommendations and provide budget estimates for the recommended work. The study will reflect the potential for redevelopment of an underutilized downtown industrial site.
