

- ▶ In 1994, 573 dentists reported working in Maine: 515 of those dentists reported having a primary specialty area. 75% of those dentists who reported a primary specialty reported that it was general practice (387).
- ▶ 2 1/2% fewer dentists who declared a primary specialty in 1994 reported general practice as their primary specialty than in 1986.
- More than half of the dentists who reported a primary specialty of general practice were younger than 45 years old (52%). While 41% of dentists who reported a specialty other than general practice as their primary specialty were between 45 and 54 years old, only 28% of general practice dentists were in that age group.



There were approximately 3,200 Maine residents for each general practice dentist in 1994; nationwide there were approximately 2,100 residents for each general practice dentist.'

Although 61% of general practice dentists reported treating Medicaid patients in 1994, 69 of those general practitioners (29%) limited the percentage of Medicaid patients in their practice to 25% or less.
