  - Act as a bridge between providers and individuals to promote health, reduce disparities, and improve service delivery
  - Advocate for individual and community needs

#### Migrant Farmworkers


- Live in temporary housing to do agricultural work
- Primary harvests:
  - Apples, Broccoli, Blueberries, Potatoes, Forestry, Wreaths
- Areas and cultures of origin:
  - Haiti, Mexico, Central America, Jamaica, Native American/First Nation, Puerto Rico

#### Seasonal Farmworkers

- Live in Maine year-round, work seasonally
- Primary harvests:
  - Dairy, Poultry, Aquaculture

  - Mexico, Central America

## **DELIVERY MODEL**

#### Mobile clinics:

- Primary care (preventative and acute)
- Behavioral health
- Chronic disease management
- Prescriptions
- COVID-19 testing and vaccination
- Referrals for other types of care (dental, vision, specialty)

#### Care coordination:

- Support looking for medical attention with a doctor or counselor
- Support with scheduling and interpretation for medical services
- Help with transportation for medical and emergency dental appointments
- Help accessing COVID-19 testing, vaccines, and other supports
- Health education
- Connections to other services (education, food resources, etc.)





## **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

- Our two social workers are present at most mobile unit clinics
- We work with contract Haitian-Creole speaking social workers to provide behavioral health services to Haitian patients
- They also provide year-round behavioral health services to seasonal patients
